Go thicker and you take the chance of superficial rooting and fungal torpidity, specifically in shaded or badly drained pipes areas. In high-traffic beds with resolving pockets, 1 feather from 2 inches near stems to a hair under 3 inches in the open zones. Over the season, compost decays and resolves. Intend on a light top-up the following spring instead of trying to address every little thing in one saturating layer.

Under hedges and trees, think in rings. Leave a bare zone the size of a dinner plate around woody stems. You will water better and stay clear of collar rot.
