Let's get into it — organized.

Step One: Set Your Budget Before Anything Else

This is the most common mistake. They pick a venue first. Then they figure out their dream venue ate their entire budget.

Don't do that. Rather, have an honest conversation: the two of you together need to agree how much you can spend.

Allocate percentages:

Location and food: roughly half

Photos and films: 12% or so

Dress, suit, hair, makeup: 8%

Florals and design: 10%



Sound and fun: 8%

Expert help: 10%

Emergency buffer: 8%

These numbers aren't exact. But they're a starting point.

Guest Count Determines Everything

You cannot pick a venue without knowing how many people you're inviting. A hall that fits two hundred feels empty with 80. A cozy space for 80 feels stuffed with 120.

So do this: write down names. Category one: you can't imagine the day without them. Second tier: you really want them there. Column C: nice-to-invite (coworkers, distant relatives, parents' friends).

With budget and guest list, start touring venues. Factor in:

Covered or open air — Our tropical climate is unpredictable. Always have a rain option.

Parking, Grab drop-off, and wheelchair access

Included items

Are there approved lists you must use

Friday or Sunday saves money

Venues fill 12-18 months out. Sign that contract.

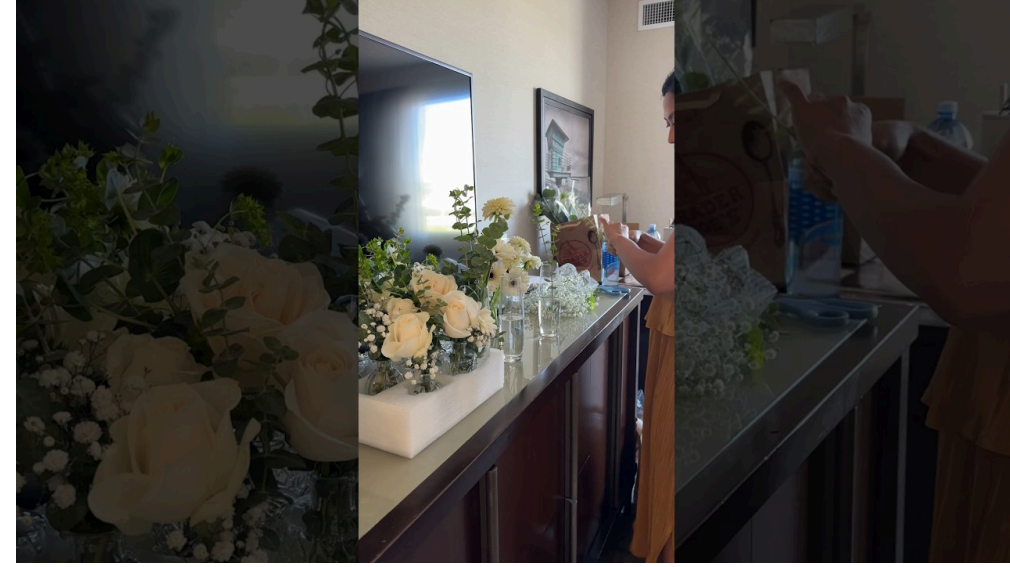
Step Four: Hire Your Wedding Planner (If You're Using One)

Step Five: Book Major Vendors (Caterer, Photographer, Band)



Immediately following the location, book these priority vendors:

Caterer (if not in-house)

Media coverage

Band or DJ

Your celebrant

These suppliers book 12-18 months out. Delay too much, and you'll get leftovers.

Save-the-Dates Aren't Optional Anymore

For celebrations in the same city, 6 months is fine. For destination weddings, send them 8-10 months out.

What to include:

Your names clearly

Wedding date

Town or general area

“Formal invitation to follow”

Email and WhatsApp work. But mailed save-the-dates add a nice touch.

Seventh Step: Structure Your Day

This phase is frequently rushed. Don't let that happen. You must create a realistic timeline.

Begin with when you say “I do”. Then factor in:

Processional length

Ceremony duration

Pre-reception gap

Dinner and dancing begin

Who talks and when

Cake cutting

The spotlight dances

Bouquet and garter toss

Goodbye timing

A realistic run sheet adds breathing room. Things run late. Plan for that.

Eighth Step: The Dress, The Suit, The Look

Wedding dresses take 4-8 months to arrive. Adjustments require more time after arrival.

Suits for grooms and groomsmen are faster to acquire — but don't wait.

Shop early. The worst feeling than panic-buying your gown.

Step Nine: Finalize Details and Confirm Vendors (One Month Out)

With a month to go, stop introducing new ideas. Rather, verify:

Numbers to your meal provider

Table assignments

Delivery windows and phone numbers

Ceremony rehearsal schedule

Outstanding invoices

This is also the time you obtain your legal paperwork. This is non-negotiable.

You've Done the Work—Now Let Go

This step matters more than all the others: at your reception, you're not in charge anymore. Your only job is to enjoy yourself.

If you hired a planner, let them work. If you planned alone, assign a trusted friend to handle issues so you don't have to.
