The problem and value of the automobile, not anxiety alone, should drive the call.

## **Myth 4: Open providers are unsafe**

Open trailers attract attention on the freeway, so any kind of event obtains photographed and repeated online. What does deficient onto social media are the millions of uneventful miles. Federal Motor Carrier Security Administration regulations regulate securement, tons circulation, and hours of service. Reliable providers follow common restrain points, check straps after the initial 50 to 100 miles, then at routine intervals. Cosmetic imperfections can occur, similar to they can happen when driving you drive daily, yet considerable damage is uncommon and insured.

Where proprietors encounter trouble is with edge operators who reduced corners, or with impractical expectations for an auto that already had rock chips and door dings prior to pickup. ## **Myth 9: Coast to coastline always takes a week**
