- Vacuum with a crevice tool

Alongside your kit, a plastic putty knife or an old gift card works for lifting debris from tracks without scratching. Avoid razor scrapers unless you are removing labels which can haze glass and chew finishes.

Cleaning Glass the Right Way - No Streaks, No Damage

Clean glass well with minimal solution and strong method. Mix a drop of dish soap in a bucket, wipe with a damp cloth, then buff dry with a clean microfiber. If you prefer a spray, use vinegar and distilled water at 1:1. Choose an overcast day, not under direct sun, since hot panes flash-dry and streak.

Now that the method is clear, watch your edges. Jabbing at corners risks lifting sealant, which later shows up as fogging between panes. If you must remove stuck-on debris, dampen it for a minute first, then lift gently with the plastic putty knife.

To keep vinyl looking new, rinse after dust storms and renew with a UV-safe protectant designed for exterior vinyl twice a year. A semiannual protectant consistently holds off chalking and fading, especially on south and west exposures.

If you own wood-clad units, set a calendar reminder. Each spring, inspect for hairline cracks and seam gaps. Touch up paint where sun has baked it thin, and re-caulk any gaps at trim joints with a paintable, exterior-grade sealant.

For composites and fiberglass, the playbook is simple: mild soap and water, soft cloth, and a twice-yearly check of corner keys and gaskets. Treat gaskets with a silicone-safe conditioner so they do not dry in the Texas sun.

Tracks, Weep Holes, and Drainage - The Overlooked Essentials

On service calls, most sticky windows are not broken, they are dirty, particularly in lower sills and weep holes. Those small slots at the bottom edge drain rainwater, and when they clog, water pools and seeps where it should not.

Weatherstripping: Inspect, Clean, Replace
