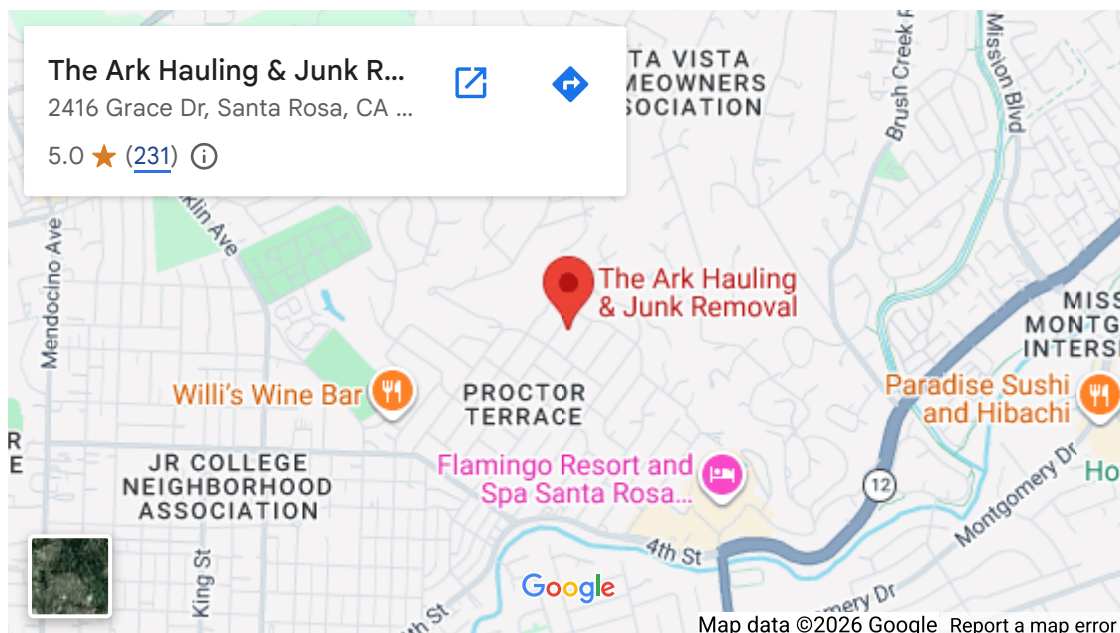

A few of it is garbage. A few of it has resale worth. Some of it might be recycled, and some requirements special handling.
