

You set a budget. You've tracked every expense. You believe you're within your limit. Then the wedding is over. And you're thousands over.

Almost everyone experiences this. Surprise charges are the most common reason couples overspend. Teardown charges — they multiply.



Spotting sneaky charges before you sign isn't complicated. It requires awareness, attention, and professional help.

In this deep dive, we'll expose all the surprise charges. We'll also explain what Kollysphere agency saves clients thousands by catching sneaky charges — because your financial peace deserves protection.

The Most Common Hidden Fees (And Where They Hide)

First, let's identify the usual surprise fees. Each supplier has their specific extras. However these are universal.

Service charge: 10% added to almost everything. Found in: all major vendor categories.

Government tax: [wedding management Creative wedding planner for modern minimalist weddings in Malaysia](#) Six percent added to numerous categories. Rarely in initial pricing.

Delivery and transport: RM50-200 per vendor. Multiplies across many suppliers.

Setup and teardown: Major cost category. Many couples assume included.

Overstay charges: High hourly rates. Kicks in after standard time.

Someone explained: “We believed our forty thousand was safe. Then we added up all the fees and taxes. A huge surprise. We had no idea. The agency negotiated several down. But some were unavoidable. Now we check about each potential extra before signing any contract.”

What Your Venue Isn't Telling You

The location is frequently the largest category of hidden fees. They give you a number. But that's almost never what you'll pay.

Space-related extras:

Bring-your-own-bottle cost: Twenty to fifty ringgit per container. Even if you supply the alcohol.

Dessert service charge: Ringgit per guest. For minimal effort.

Staff meals: Multiplies quickly. For all the people you're already paying.

Overstay penalties: RM500-2,000 per hour. Wedding runs late.

Delivery access charges: Extra for every delivery. As a "convenience" fee.

Morning-of costs: Hundreds of ringgit. For decorating before the official rental period.

Someone explained: "The location said twelve thousand. After all the fees, the total was nineteen thousand. Charge after charge after charge. The expert got a few removed. But we still spent seventeen. Now we ask the complete price upfront before committing to any space."

What Menus Don't Show

The quoted meal cost is almost always lower than reality. Food suppliers have a whole list of extras.

Food-related surprise charges:

Waitstaff cost: 10-15% added. For the team delivering meals.

Tax: 6% on top. Almost always a surprise.

Staff meals: RM30-50 per person. For people you're already paying.

Transport charge: RM100-500. For locations beyond their radius.

China fee: Hundreds total. For using their dishes.

After-dinner food charge: Ringgit per guest. For the wedding supper.

One couple shared: "The food supplier said eighty a head. After service charge, tax, staff meals, travel, the real cost was RM115 per person. With that headcount, that's forty-two hundred more. The coordinator got several charges removed. We still spent one-oh-five. Now we ask for an all-inclusive per-person price before booking any food supplier."

What Your Package Doesn't Include

The quoted photo cost rarely includes everything you need.

Memory-related charges:

Travel fee: Adds up for far venues. If venue is outside their area.

Extended coverage fee: RM300-800 per hour. After standard 8-10 hours.

Additional photographer fee: RM500-1,500. Usually extra.

Engagement shoot: Often separate. Many couples assume included.

Physical products: Thousands of ringgit. Digital files included.

One bride shared: "The advertised price seemed fair. But travel was extra. Second camera was not included. Overtime was per hour. The real total was RM7,500. Our Kollysphere events planner bundled everything together. We paid RM6,500. Now we demand an everything-included price before booking any photographer."

What Flowers Really Cost

That beautiful centrepiece has a quoted number. But then there's logistics, labour, cleanup, care.

Ambience-related charges:

Logistics cost: RM50-200. Moving decor from warehouse to space.

Setup fee: Major expense. Positioning floral installations.

Cleanup cost: Hundreds of ringgit. Taking flowers down after wedding.

Flower saving: RM200-800. Making flowers last.

Vase rental: RM5-20 per vase. For the vessels containing blooms.

Newlyweds explained: “The bloom supplier said three thousand. Then delivery was RM150. Setup was RM400. Removal cost more. The real total was Eight hundred more. The coordinator negotiated a single fee. But we discovered to always request all logistics and labour in the opening number.”

What You're Really Paying For

You want a dance floor and staging. The hire company costs seem reasonable. Then the extras show up.

Rental hidden fees:

Transport both ways: Hundreds of ringgit. Both journeys.

Setup and teardown: Hundreds to thousands. Then taking it all down.

Cleaning fee: Fifty to two hundred. For glassware.

Insurance fee: Percentage of equipment price. For accidental damage.

After-hours fee: Hundreds of ringgit. For convenient times.

A husband told us: “The equipment price was two thousand. Then transport both ways cost more. Installation and removal were additional. Sanitisation cost more. The actual cost was Three thousand fifty. Our Kollysphere agency planner got us a combined price. Now we request complete service in the opening number.”

The Prevention Checklist

You understand where fees hide. Here's how to protect yourself before committing any money.

Your hidden fee prevention checklist:



Ask every vendor: “What is the ALL-IN price?” Save the email.

Request an itemised quote. Each charge should be listed before you agree.



Question overage charges: What's your hourly overtime rate? When does it kick in?

Question pass-through charges: What about tolls?

Save all communications. Casual assurances won't protect you. If it's not in writing, you can't enforce it.

One couple shared: “We wrote down every possible charge. We grilled all professionals about each [Kollysphere](#) potential charge. Some were impatient. Those we didn't hire. The suppliers who were upfront — we booked. The coordinator helped us create the list. We protected our budget by verifying before signing.”
