The "Does This Actually Matter" Filter

The ones who focus on the 20% are the most efficient . Find your 20% . helps identify .

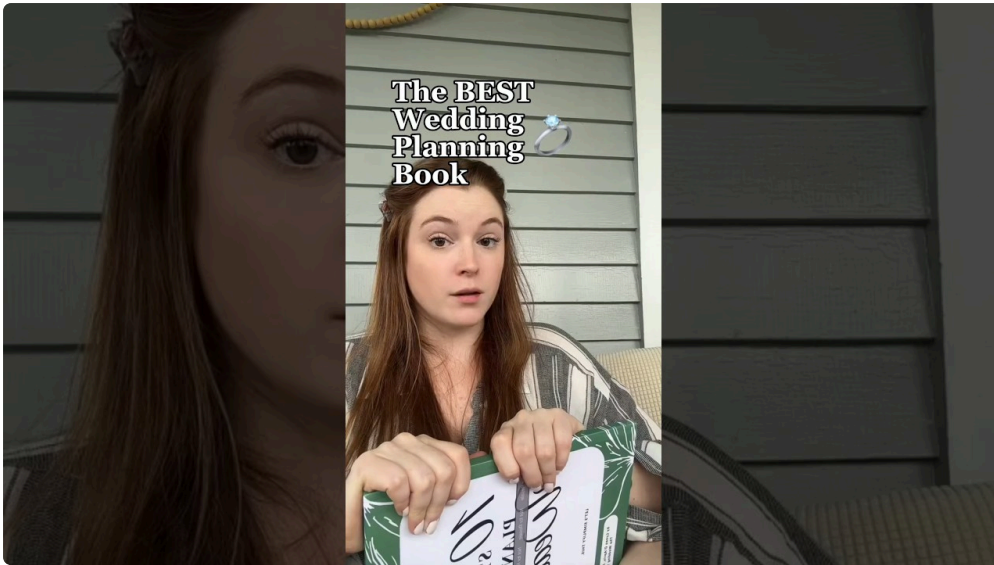
The "Delegate or Delete" Decision Tree

Second gate : "Can I delegate this" . If yes , give it away. To a trusted friend. If no , handle it . But do it efficiently . That's the decision tree. Ignore, give away, or handle. 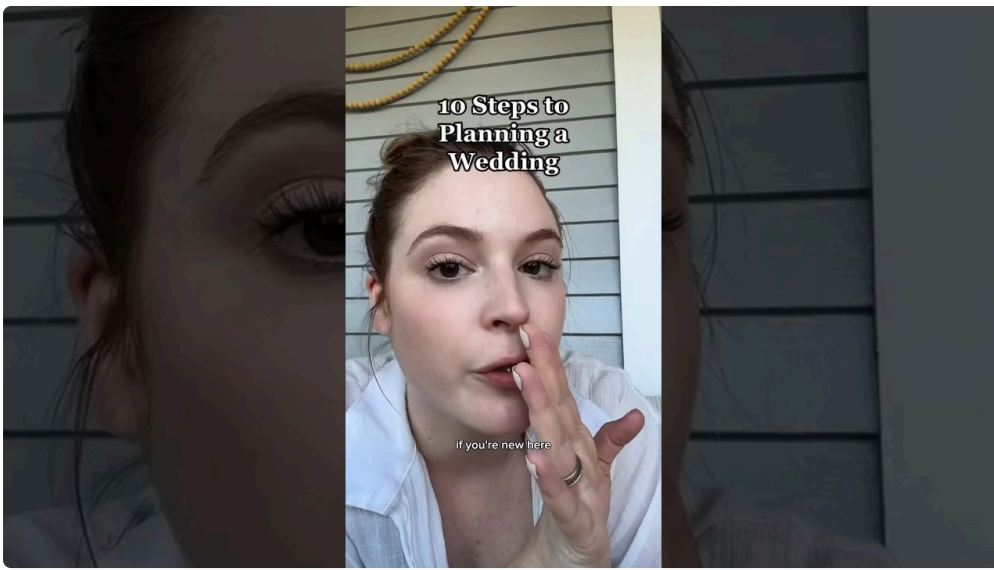
