Shopping and Entertainment Hotspots

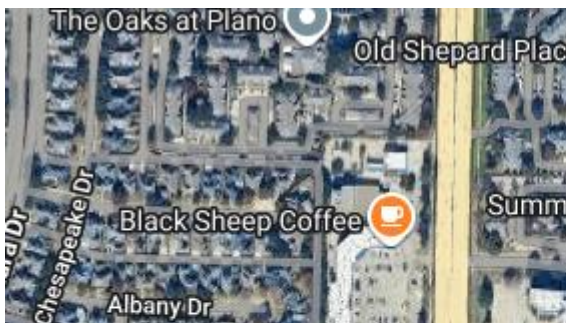
