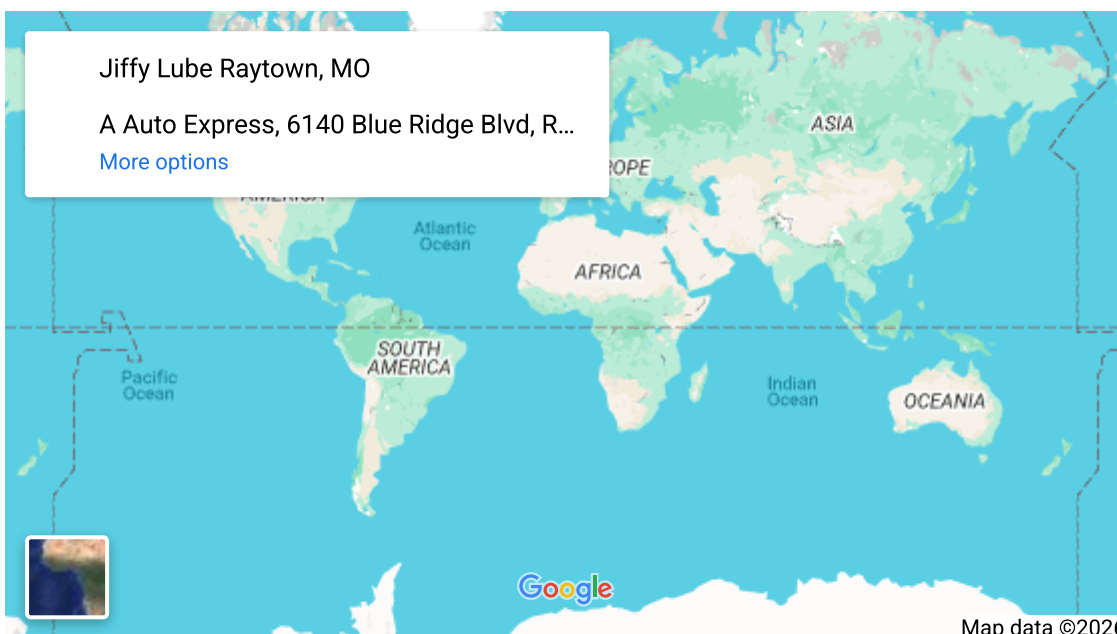


Wheel alignment affects tire wear, fuel economy, and the way your vehicle tracks on the road. A vehicle that pulls to one side, wanders on straight roads, or has tires developing unusual wear patterns likely has alignment outside the manufacturer's specification. A Auto Express in Raytown provides wheel alignment service for all vehicle makes and models. Alignment problems develop from the normal impacts of **Auto Repair Raytown** driving. Hitting potholes, striking curbs, and minor collisions all disturb the **Raytown car shop** alignment angles set at the factory. Raytown's roads, like any urban environment, present enough opportunities for these disturbances that periodic alignment checks are good maintenance practice. Three alignment angles are adjusted during a wheel alignment: camber (the inward or outward tilt of the tire when viewed from the front), toe (the inward or outward angle of the tires when viewed from above), and caster (the forward or rearward tilt of the steering axis). Each affects handling and tire wear differently.

Toe alignment errors produce the most dramatic tire wear effects. A tire that is pointing inward or outward relative to the direction of travel scrubs its tread surface with every revolution. This wear is visible as feathering or sagging of the tread blocks and accelerates tire wear significantly. Alignment verification after any suspension work is always appropriate. Replacing shocks, struts, ball joints, tie rod ends, or control arm bushings changes the position of suspension components relative to each other, which can alter alignment angles.
