



Homes in Houston tend to be lived in hard. Between Gulf Coast humidity, pollen drifting in from the pines, and the everyday bustle of kids and pets, carpets take a beating. We pulled 6 linear feet of carpet, replaced a strip of pad, sealed the slab edge with an odor barrier, and reinstalled the carpet, which stretched back cleanly. The room dried in about eight hours with two air movers and the ceiling fan. The beagle wore a nighttime belly band while the couple worked with their vet. Three months later, the odor had not returned.

The lesson is not that every room [carpet cleaning houston](#) needs pad pulled, but that tailored work beats cookie-cutter cleaning. The combination of detection, targeted chemistry, and structural fixes where needed delivered a result that stuck.
